- **OER Violations:** Instead of compiling an exhaustive list of infractions, the council agreed to introduce a broader agenda topic focusing on observed procedural frictions. Carla endorsed this approach, and Noor will draft the formal meeting piece.
- **Introductory Town Hall with the New Dean:** Members noted with concern that the previously requested Town Hall meeting with the incoming Dean has not yet materialized. .
- **Meeting Logistics & Inclusivity:** A procedural issue was raised regarding a past meeting with the new Dean, where attendance was restricted to four representatives, and one council member failed to receive a calendar invitation
- Vincent noted that an official inquiry at the CSR is not necessary, as the faculty's reliance on American software was already a widely discussed topic during the recent PV's and OV's. When questioned during an OV, the Board stated they are currently exploring ways to separate from American software. However, due to existing vendor contracts, this transition must be handled on a case-by-case basis. Because the final PV and OV of the academic year have already concluded, securing a formal, written statement from the faculty is not possible at this time. To ensure the issue isn't lost, Vincent will brief the incoming delegate to keep this topic on the agenda for the upcoming year.
 - Danial will continue to write a dedicated meeting piece regarding the faculty's reliance on American software before next Tuesday.
- Johannes highlighted a bottleneck with Facility Services. While booking engagement spaces required a single email in previous years, the current decentralized process requires dealing with multiple contacts, causing significant administrative delay. This will be brought to the OV table.

5. FMG unsolicited advice



The question was whether to co-sign the unsolicited advice drafted by FSR-FMG on permanent Contemplation Spaces at REC. Discussion mostly focused on concern raised by Vincent regarding gender-separated spaces and inclusivity. Danial argued that the set-up remains inclusive as the physical partition consists of a curtain rather than a structural wall. Carla agreed with this.
