#### 7. BO debrief

#### General

Kasper thinks that it went well. Some things fit better in an IO. But overall very well.

Eloïse was a bit frustrated that she couldn't bring up all her points. She also thinks that it was a bit harder with a translator.

Saar talked about the translator as well and says that in the CSR people wait a bit.

Nina thinks that it made it harder for the translator when the DT turned their heads.

## Language requirements





Kasper thinks it went fine. The only thing was that if they want to change the model OER they have to be quick. One of the next PVs we are going to talk about it.

## **Update new programs**

Saar thinks it's odd they still don't know what to do with the OERen and OCs.

Kasper states that the council asked it previous year, but that there is still no procedure.

## **Update quality agreements**

Kasper thinks that language in education is the main point, since the whole scientific world is in English.

Robin says that he made a point that it was an UvA-wide thing. He doesn't fully understand it.

Maas answers that it is since there are many international students at Roeters, but that he wants to make clear that it is not at Science Park.

Melanie says that if it is still unclear, then ask it in the IO.

Dave says that internalization is a big thing in politics, but right now it is a waiting game. He says that the DT is monitoring this topic.

Eloïse asks whether the problem with too many international students is that Dutch students can't get access anymore.





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Melanie says that there are a lot of masters where the deadline is earlier for international students and that that causes problems.

Kasper says that there is a programme that has a selection based on first come first served. And therefore a lot of Dutch students didn't get their spot.

Nina asks whether there are numbers on how many international students.

## Mental Health: Psychologists on campus

Eloïse was a bit frustrated, but says that it wasn't too bad.

Kasper says that Peter was very understanding.

Eloïse felt there was a discrepancy between them.

Joanna says that it was hard for them to understand our point of view.

- a. Questions from the TLC (1 through 6)

#### **Question 1**

Nina says that she writes up the entire presentation and then has a better understanding

Eloïse never used it.

Robin mostly uses it for homework questions where they ask for data analysis.

Saar thinks that students use it in almost every situation except for formulas and when it is not possible to write the problem.





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Joanna doesn't use it a lot, but for inspiration.

Kasper thinks that it is mostly used for easy questions such as explain something or summarize this. He used it once to structure his essay.

Eloïse says that it is hard to use it for chemistry.

Robin says that he didn't understand a subject and he asked chatGPT, but that it didn't really help.

Nina says that people definitely hand in parts written by chatGPT.

## **Question 2**

Saar uses it during exam week. Not to copy stuff, but if she has a lot of pressure, she is more inclined to use it. And she uses it to go over a subject.

Dave uses it when he is running out of time.

#### **Question 3**

Nina asks chatGPT a lot of questions about the updates and how specific it is.

Robin asks whether he can ask chatGPT about papers. And he asks how good the anti-plagiarism tools are.

Joanna says it isn't able to accept other papers.

Melanie says that there are AI tools that look specific at papers.





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Eloïse wants to know how to use it correctly.

Saar says that some students know how to prompt chatGPT, some not.

#### **Question 4**

Robin wants to know when he can and can't use chatGPT.

Melanie says it depends on the student.

Kasper thinks that the most important role is that the teacher of a course (that includes writing) should say whether and how to use chatGPT.

Chris likes it when a teacher acknowledges chatGPT and uses it in the homework to reflect.

Saar thinks how to integrate it in academic skills and how to use it responsibly. And she thinks that it should change the way of education.

Eloïse follows a philosophy of science course and she has a lecturer who asked for a reference if they used chatGPT. The acknowledgement and honesty are important for her.

## **Question 5**

Chris thinks it works really good and sometimes works very bad.

Kasper thinks that it is very good for easy lazy assignments. It is a loophole to expose bad questions.

Nina thinks it really helps her studying, since the Dutch system is completely different and good for adjustment.





Robin thinks it is good to answer tedious assignments that are non-mandatory.

Melanie seeks for steps of assignments.

Saar uses it as a search engine, since chatGPT gives her a better answer and is shorter.

Lola thinks that non-genai text to speech is very bad.

#### **Question 6**

Melanie sometimes tries to figure out an answer, but she is discussing a lot with chatGPT for a wanted answer.

Saar says it is very incorrect sometimes. She thinks that the source of information is missing.

Nina says that all the references and sources are fake.

Kasper says that the paid version is connected to the internet and can give references and sources. He says that it sounds very good, but that it is very bad.

Robin says that chatGPT gives answers with a lot of confidence.

Lola asks whether it saves what you prompt and doesn't know whether it is okay.







Saar says that some people can afford the pro edition and that it creates inequality.

Robin says it is an overall problem, since you can also buy answers to assignments.

Nina is asking what database is used, especially for politics and biases.

## b. Questions about the e-module

## i. What did you think of the e-module in general?

Kasper thinks that the information they give is very nice and it works very well. The narrator could have been more enthusiastic.

Maas thinks that the e-module can't answer questions 1 till 6.

Kasper says that the e-module indeed can't since the UvA hasn't have a clear policy.

Saar thinks that the part of limitations is very good and that it is better explained than in the BSc AI.

Kasper says that doing the e-module is a nice addition to academic skills, especially when there is a clear policy.

# ii. Are there changes/additions to the e-module you would like to see?

Kasper wants to change the fraud and plagiarism part. He thinks that jumping from fraud and plagiarism to their conclusion is not very well written. He wants to make it more concrete when there is policy.





Joanna says that the e-module also stipulates that you can't use it for inspiration and she thinks that it is as well a big step.

Robin thinks they have to go into how genAI uses other people's work.

Kasper says that they link to a bunch of pages and that it is very interesting to be more informed about the ethical parts.
