#### 4. OV Agenda

- Militarization: Carla confirmed that following consultation with Noor, the item will remain on the agenda with an updated text paragraph.
- Grading Transparency: Livni confirmed the inclusion of an agenda item pushing for explicit grading rubrics to increase transparency.
- Faculty Board Agenda Items: The Board has tabled three main topics for the upcoming cycle:
  1. *Faculty Strategic Plan (FSP)*: Developing a comprehensive narrative regarding the future of education within the faculty.
  2. *ALF Reorientation*: Redesigning and restructuring the Bachelor's curriculum, specifically exploring different scenarios for ECTS (EC) distribution.



3. *Thesis Trajectories*: Restructuring thesis guidelines for the upcoming academic year to account for rapid developments in AI.

## 5. New Council Boat Ride

**A proposal was made by Livni to organize a boat ride for the incoming council in mid-June.**

- **Budget Discussion:** The council has €300 remaining in its dedicated bonding budget, but holds a €1,500 total budget surplus. Danial opposed the expenditure, arguing that funds should be redirected to independent student initiatives, particularly since the council already traveled to Scotland. Vince noted that a vote could not occur without exact quotes. The boat ride is estimated to cost between €600 and €800.
- A formal vote and "When2Meet" scheduling will be deferred to the next PV

## 6. University Software Origins

- In light of the recent Canvas security breach, the council voted in favor of demanding an assessment of UvA software providers. Carla confirmed this should be raised at the upcoming OV. Vince will also introduce the topic at the CSR level to address institutional over-dependence on American software providers.

## 7. Political Party Funding

- Danial reported that faculty parties found the CSR's updates on election funding vague and delayed. Vince clarified that the central treasurer (himself) had not been briefed on their responsibilities in a timely manner, but that the funding applications were processed as soon as possible.

## 8. Axios Exclusion

In response to an inquiry from Fabian, Vince clarified that the Axios party was excluded from funding solely due to a late application submission.

## 9. Casual UvA Vote

- The Axios party published voting records revealing that the council's CSR delegate, Vince, voted against a petition supporting the "Casual UvA" movement (concerning employment conditions for D4 teaching staff).
- Vince justified his vote by stating the petition lacked data and factual backing.
- Danial and Carla expressed frustration that the council was not briefed on this high-profile vote beforehand. Danial noted a lack of constructive communication when inquiries were raised. Vince countered that delegates cannot report on every fast-tracked items due to volume constraints, and urged council members to proactively read CSR minutes.
- Carla intervened with a general directive regarding internal communication, noting a negative shift in the tone of the council's Signal group chat. Members were reminded to remain constructive, professional, and amicable in their written language.

## 10. Formal Recognition extracurricular activities students – update

Vince is scheduled to meet with relevant stakeholders tomorrow morning and will deliver an update directly afterward.

## 11. Updates

### a. CSR

- House rules finally passed after two years
- A new central student assessor has been successfully selected.
- Changes made to profiling fund, still discussed in CSR
- Housing plan is discussed but confidential
- Vince worked on Q1 for budget



- Vince is working on umbrella procedure on issuing soliciting advice
- Issued unsolicited advice on CVB selection procedure,
- An entire committee has dissolved after activism at AMC, very controversial piece so there is discussion happening within CSR. Activisten partij believed there were unfair practices. Report was issued one sidedly, accusations were made without data, no room for MFAS to discuss.
- Militarization update: FNWI writing paper and perspective of student council, so not update but how do we feel about it? Carla advised Vince to look over the meeting piece we had
